Our mission is to improve the livelihood, sovereignty, and cultural vibrancy of tribal citizens by empowering Lakota Native American youth with education.

Our story begins with an epiphany. When one says they teach in a Native American reservation many questions follow. What is it like? Who have you met? How different is it? This is natural, given the severe lack of fundamental understanding most Americans have of anything Native American. Many see reservation land as an almost mystical unknown or have thoroughly incorrect preconceived notions of it. It is as saddening as it is unsurprising, though, because movies, sports mascots, and other mass media successfully distribute an incorrect impression of reservation life. So what is the epiphany? To improve reservation conditions is not to alter a way of life, but to alter the impression we have of it.

Would you guess that chiefs are no longer as influential on reservations? The Kansas City Chiefs' mascot may tell you otherwise. Or would you guess that headdresses are not an everyday fixture? The famous Disney movie Peter Pan may tell you otherwise. To the contrary, the majority of tribal citizens are blue-jean-wearing folk that enjoy much of the same activities as you do. The difference? They contain a spirited, venerable culture that tells of only the most virtuous aspects of human character: togetherness, dignity, and respect, among others. There is something special about a culture that has persisted through centuries of persecution, and we have much to learn from it.

Education is the solution to this issue of misperception. It opens the mind and lends perspective. It allows one to critically analyze one's surroundings and position in society. If Native American youth are empowered with such skills and afforded a critical lens through which to view themselves and others, the possibilities are endless. Perhaps a student will begin to realize that reservations, as sovereign entities, should be wholly self-sufficient, and invent a solution for that. Perhaps a student will become a congressman or congresswoman that is willing to fight for their people. This work will take a village, a village of ambitious, educated youth privy to the world around them.

Our Unique Approach

We were not the first to notice low higher education attainment rates among Lakota native people, but we are attacking the issue differently:

We are a private entity, completely independent of the Rosebud Sioux Tribe. A revolving, five-person selection committee composed of community leaders in education decides how much an applicant is awarded, rather than any committee of tribal council or council itself. This ensures that distribution of funds is impartial and merit-based, which has not always occured in the past.

We hold close relationships with top Rosebud Sioux Tribe decision makers. So, we are working towards the tribe's best educational interests with every decision we make.

Our executives do not receive salaries. Our only overhead expenses are marketing materials, registration fees, and support staff payments. This amounts to no more than 5% of funds raised.

We are the only scholarship fund that exclusively supports Lakota Native Americans, thus acknowledging the specific challenges that they face.

We give our students freedom of choice. They may use our funding to attend any higher education program that exists, whether that is four-year, two-year, or trade or vocational school. In a survey performed by the Rosebud Sioux Tribe, over 75% of students said they wanted to be in a higher education program the fall after graduating high school.

How do we help?

We fill the gap between the total cost of attendance and a student's financial aid award.

We calculate this gap as the program's advertised annual cost of attendance less a student's total award package. If no gap exists, then we consider awarding a grant to lessen the burden of taking out loans, if applicable; this is subject to a student's demonstrated financial hardship. We may not award a student in the full amount of the gap; this is subject to the strength of their application and availability of funds. It is a multi-year award.

Executive Team

Has final say over all matters concerning the Rosebud Scholarship Fund and is in close contact with the Rosebud Sioux Tribe.

Board of Directors

Approves decisions made by the executive team. It is composed entirely of Rosebud Sioux Tribal citizens.

Selection Committee

A revolving, impartial panel that selects students to be awarded. They are composed of community leaders in education.

Five members to be interviewed and selected by the executive team

Eligibility

A student must meet the following requirements if they are eligible to earn a scholarship from the Rosebud Scholarship Fund:



Must be a current senior in high school with a minimum 2.0 GPA.

This low GPA requirement is to ensure that the funds are not reserved for the academic elite. A 2.0 GPA can be all it takes to succeed in trade school or a two-year program.



Must be an enrolled member of the Rosebud Sioux Tribe.

Citizens of the Oglala Sioux Tribe, Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe, or Standing Rock Sioux Tribe are welcome to apply, but Rosebud Sioux citizens will be given strict priority to members of other Lakota tribes.



Must be accepted to a four-year degree program, two-year degree program, or trade or vocational program.

The start date must be the upcoming fall as of the date the application is submitted.



Must provide proof of financial need.

This may be any official government document, and it must represent an inability to fully cover relevant program expenses.
