- **WHEREAS**, from the time of their arrival in America, European Nations acknowledged Native Nations as sovereigns, with the power of war and peace, trade and commerce, territorial integrity and self-governance;
- WHEREAS, the American Republic, through treaty-making acknowledged the status of Native Nations as sovereigns from its first days;

- the Apportionment Clause recognizes Native Peoples as citizens of Native Nations, not directly subject to the United States authority; and
- the 14th Amendment Citizenship Clause and amended Apportionment Clause recognizes Native Peoples as citizens of Native Nations under tribal jurisdiction—not U.S. jurisdiction.
- WHEREAS, our Indian Nations fought wars to protect our inherent natural rights to life, liberty and sovereignty and to preserve our connection to Grandmother Earth and through treaties, the United States and Native Nations recognizes tribal rights to self-government;
- WHEREAS, Federally Recognized Indian Tribes today are Native Nations, and our Native People maintain our sovereign authority and rights to self-determination, self-government and autonomy;
- WHEREAS, in Alaska, Alaska Native villages are Indian tribes and Native Nations;
- WHEREAS, Alaska Native Corporations were created under state law in the 1970s, and serve the interests of Alaska Native shareholders—not the prior Native Peoples and Native community, and because the genesis of their legal existence is the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act, not the Will of the Native People—Alaska Native Corporations can never be Indian nations or Indian tribes;
- WHEREAS, Alaska Native Corporations are subordinate to state law by virtue of their creation under state law, and Alaska Native shareholders accepted this state law status, reserving their traditional Native Nation status for Alaska Native villages governed by Alaska Native Peoples;
- whereas, the Federal District Court decision in *Chehalis v. Mnuchin*, _____ F.3d _____ (2020) ruling that Alaska Native Corporations are Indian tribes is a fundamental violation of the rights of Native Peoples as Human Beings endowed by our Creator with Life, Liberty and our Sacred Duty to Grandmother Earth;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Rosebud Sioux Tribe rejects the ruling of the Federal District Court denominating Alaska Native Corporations—state chartered entities owing their existence to state law—as Indian tribes and declares that Alaska Native Corporations can never be Indian tribes;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Rosebud Sioux Tribe calls upon Congress to respect the human rights of Native Peoples by reserving the Federal recognition of Indian tribes to our Native Nations that were established by the Native Peoples at the beginning of time with our Natural Law Rights to Life, Liberty and our Sacred Duty to Grandmother Earth; Accordingly, in future legislation, Congress must use the Federally Recognized Indian Tribe List Act to work with our Native Nations;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Rosebud Sioux Tribe calls upon the National Congress of American Indians to reject the ruling of the Federal District Court in Chehalis v. Mnuchin, ____ F.3d ___ as a violation of our human rights, inherent sovereignty, our self-government and our self-determination;
