SWA has collaborated with Tribal Partners and the RST COVID Task Force to identify priorities and develop a proposal to assist the Tribe in preventing the spread of this deadly virus. The following is a breakdown of how the SWA Corporation is proposing to spend the funding being requested to prevent, prepare for and respond to COVID 19.

#### **Homeless Shelters**

\$661,200

The proposal includes funding to renovate both shelters to provide our most vulnerable population with added safety to promote social distancing and good hygiene practice distancing. In an effort to keep the shelters sanitary and well stocked with supplies needed to ensure residents have basic necessities to shelter in place (clothing, PPE, hygiene products, towels, working appliances, bedding, towels, and food). We have also included new smart televisions so the homeless may have access to the internet to keep updated on Tribal COVID News. Computers will be purchased to ensure the children have access to distance learning. The funding will also pay utilities at both shelters for 12 months and provide one transport vehicle for the Rosebud Shelter. Storage sheds are needed at each shelter to keep supplies free of contamination. The funding will support the purchase of four tiny homes (2 for each Shelter) to accommodate homeless families. \$100,000 of the total cost is for water, sewer and electrical hook ups for the tiny homes.

#### **Elder/Pre-existing Health Conditions**

\$ 474,000

This funding will be used to provide elders and tribal members with pre-existing health conditions with resources to prevent the spread of COVID 19 amongst these highly vulnerable populations by enabling them to safely and comfortably shelter in place. Some funding will be used to supplement the Elderly Nutrition Program by allowing the program to issue monthly grocery vouchers to local stores on behalf of those who meet eligibility criteria. In an effort to promote the Tribe's Shelter in Place Order, funding will be allocated to assist the Tribe in
