

**ROSEBUD SIOUX TRIBE**  
**Resolution No. 2019-81**

**WHEREAS,** the Rosebud Sioux Tribe is a federally recognized Indian Tribe organized pursuant to the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934 and all pertinent amendments thereof; and

**WHEREAS,** the Rosebud Sioux Tribe is governed by a Tribal Council made up of elected representatives who act in accordance with the powers granted to it by its Constitution and By-Laws; and

**WHEREAS,** the Rosebud Sioux Tribal Council is authorized to promulgate and enforce ordinances for the maintenance of law and order, and to safeguard the peace and morals, and general welfare of the Tribe, and to provide for the administration of justice, pursuant to the Rosebud Sioux Tribe Constitution and By-Laws Article IV Sections 1 (a)(c), (j) and (t); and

**WHEREAS,** the Rosebud Sioux Tribal Council has declared a state of emergency on at least two occasions when it comes to the methamphetamine crisis; and

**WHEREAS,** the Rosebud Sioux Tribe Police Department is about to run out of funds to pay lab and testing fees for drug evidence confiscated during the law enforcement and investigative process; and

**WHEREAS,** the Rosebud Sioux Tribe Prosecutor's Office is in need of the evidence to prosecute these drug crimes and need the lab testing as field tests are easily challenged in court; and


**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Rosebud Sioux Tribal Council does hereby appropriate the sum of \$50,000 to the Rosebud Sioux Tribe Police Department for the purposes of paying for the testing of drug evidence and the witness fees that may result from the processing of that evidence.

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
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

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
