Resolution No. 2020-172
RESCINDED: 05-13-21

- WHEREAS,** The Rosebud Sioux Tribe is a federally recognized Indian Tribe organized pursuant to the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934 and pertinent amendments therefore;
- WHEREAS,** The Rosebud Sioux Tribe is governed by a Tribal Council made up of elected representatives who act in accordance with the powers granted to it by its Constitution and By-laws;
- WHEREAS,** The Sicangu Lakota language, history and culture is the Sovereignty of the Sicangu Lakota Oyate;
- WHEREAS,** The Rosebud Sioux Tribe Constitution Article IV—Powers of Rosebud Sioux Tribal Council paragraph (r) states “to exchange and foster the arts, crafts, traditions and culture of the Sioux”;
- WHEREAS,** The Rosebud Sioux Tribe signed Resolution No. 2020-80 on March 25, 2020, which “declares a state of emergency with the loss of Lakota Language fluency on the Rosebud Sioux Indian Reservation” and calls on all tribal department to support efforts to revitalize the language;
- WHEREAS,** The Rosebud Sioux Tribe Resolution No. 2020-80 “declares that the Lakota language, history, and culture is of the highest priority, and that the teaching of Lakota Language, History and Culture shall not be inhibited for any reason”; and
- WHEREAS,** The following Department of the Interior, Bureau of Indian Affairs, Office of Indian Energy and Economic Development (IIED) has issued a grant notice for a Living Languages Grant Program (LLGP), CFDA #15.151, with a grant period of one year, an award ceiling of \$200,000 and a closing date for applications on August 13, 2020. The total cost of this project is budgeted at \$199,225; and
- WHEREAS,** The RST Education Department and Todd County School District have developed a Lakota Language Project which titled, Wičhóuŋčhaǵe Íchičheyagthunpi - Bridging Generations Language Revitalization Project, and its goal to create more curricular materials and pedagogical tools for the local schools who serve the students on the Rosebud Reservation; and
- WHEREAS,** The Department of the Interior, Bureau of Indian Affairs, Office of Indian Energy and Economic Development (IIED), Living Languages Grant Program (LLGP) awards may not be used for: indirect costs or administrative costs as defined by the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR); legal fees; contract negotiation fees; and any other activities not authorized by the grant award letter; and
- WHEREAS,** The proposed project is at the benefit of the Sicangu Oyate in terms of language revitalization and capacity building for future generations, and is deemed to outweigh the loss of indirect cost revenue; and
- WHEREAS,** The Rosebud Sioux Tribe waives the indirect costs in the amount of \$46, 678.42 and will allocate funding to cover the indirect costs for this project and application; now

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THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, The Rosebud Sioux Tribe supports the Wičhóuŋčhaġe Íchičheyagthŋpi - Bridging Generations Language Revitalization Project, and RST Education and Todd County School District's partnership in their application to the Department of Interior, Bureau of Indian Affairs, Office of Indian Energy and Economic Development (IIED); and


